COUNCIL ON JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATION

Administrative Order No. 87-37

In accordance with Administrative Order No. 87-17, the Chief Justice may appoint standing committees of the Council on Judicial Administration to assist the Council in carrying out its responsibilities. Now, therefore, in order to assure the proper development of legislation affecting the judicial branch of government and the proper coordination of legislative programs throughout the judiciary,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. A standing Committee on Legislation is created to advise the Chief Justice and the Council on Judicial Administration on all relevant matters pertaining to state and federal legislation affecting the operations and procedures of the judiciary in the State of Arizona.
- 2. A chairman and vice chairman of the Committee on Legislation shall be appointed by the Chief Justice.
- 3. The chairman, or, in his absence, the vice-chairman, may appoint subcommittees to assist the committee in carrying out its responsibilities.
- 4. The committee shall be staffed by the Administrative Office of the Courts.
