The Complainant alleged a justice of the peace pro tem made improper legal rulings and was not listening to her in an eviction case.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

During my eviction hearing on Judge asked if either me or my ex husband had anything to add as to why this case should be looked into further. Judge referred to my tone of voice but it was nervousness that he was hearing in my tone. He misinterpreted it as me getting angry with him and I tried to explain this to him but he refused to hear me. I am also a disabled person with no means to support myself. My ex husband abandoned me with the apartment. I tried to expalin this to and other points as well but he continually kept messing with his hearing aids and I feel Judge he was not paying attention to what I was saying. I tried explaining to him that I went to my leasing office to get help and they refused to give me the resources I needed to be able to continue to live at the residence. I am currently in the state of . living with my with no means to support myself as I am unable to work due to my disability. He proceeded to tell me that I had not made a case as to why I shouldn't be held responsible for this and that there wasn't even enough for an evidentiary then proceeded to tell me he will terminate the hearing and require me to return hearing, Judge to the state of , even after I stated I have no means of doing that due to my disability. He blatantly disregarded my rights as a disabled person and refused to even grant an evidentiary hearing. I also only had a week to prepare but I didn't get the information for the eviction until due to me having no one that could check the mail and the letter didn't get forwarded to my new address as it should have been, it was sent to the apartment that is no longer occupied. I tried to explain to Judge I have been unable to work for years and that my ex husband is the one who had the means to pay for everything. There was plenty of evidence provided to him to support the need for an evidentiary hearing but, again, I feel he was not listening as everytime I spoke he would take one of his hearing aids out and play with it. I was attending the hearing via zoom and was able to clearly see that everytime I spoke he would remove the hearing aid from the ear that was facing the video and play with it.
